Betamethasone Valerate (0.1%w/w)

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What Betasolve Cream is used for

Betasolve Cream is used topically to relieve skin inflammation and itching caused by conditions like eczema, psoriasis, allergies, or rashes.

How Betasolve Cream works

Betasolve Cream contains active ingredient betamethasone valerate, which is a corticosteroid, that works by reducing inflammation, redness, and swelling on the skin. It calms the immune system's overreaction, which helps relieve itching and irritation.

Before you use Betasolve Cream

– When you must not use it

Do not use if:

- you are allergic to betamethasone valerate or any other ingredients of this medicine (listed in Product Description)
- you are being treated for any skin infections including chickenpox or rosacea (redness and bumps on the face).

– Before you start to use it

Pregnancy and Lactation

Please consult your doctor or pharmacist if you are pregnant, planning for pregnancy or breast-feeding before using any medicine.

Avoid using this cream during pregnancy unless instructed by your doctor.

Do not use this cream while breastfeeding, as it may affect the baby, though the risk is low. Always consult your doctor before use.

– Taking other medicines

Tell your doctor if you are taking any other medicines, including any that you buy without a prescription from a

pharmacy, supermarket, or health food shop.

Tell your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking:

- other medicine containing any steroids

How to use Betasolve Cream

– How much to use

For external use only.

Apply a thin layer of the cream to the affected areas.

– When to use it

Apply two to three times a day, and gently rub it in.

Once the skin gets better, reduce use to once daily or as advised by your doctor.

Wash your hands before and after applying the cream (unless the affected area is your hands).

– How long to use it

Use this medicine for the duration that your doctor recommends.

– If you forget to use it

Apply the missed dose as soon as you remember. If it is almost time for your next dose, wait until then to apply the medicine and skip the missed dose. Do not apply a double dose to make up for the missed dose.

– If you use too much (overdose)

Contact your doctor immediately or go to the Emergency Department of your nearest hospital, if you or anyone else may have used too much of this medicine. Do this even if there are no signs of discomfort or poisoning. You may need urgent medical attention.

While you are using Betasolve Cream

– Things you must do

Use your medicine exactly as your doctor has told you.

Tell all the doctors, dentists and pharmacists treating you that you are using Betasolve Cream.

Tell your doctor immediately if you become pregnant while using this medication.

– Things you must not do

Do not use any new medicines without consulting your doctor or pharmacist.

Do not give Betasolve Cream to anyone else, even if they have the same symptoms or condition as you.

– Things to be careful of

Avoid contact with eyes, nose, or mouth.

Do not use for long periods, especially on babies and children, unless directed by a doctor.

Do not use on large skin areas, wounds, or under tight bandages unless advised by a doctor.

If you experience skin irritation or skin reactions like burning or thinning of the skin, stop using it and consult a doctor.

Side Effects

Like all medicines, Betasolve Cream can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.

The cream is usually well-tolerated, but you might feel burning, itching, or dryness on the skin.

Long-term use may cause thinning of the skin or stretch marks.

You may report any side effects or adverse drug reactions directly to the National Centre for Adverse Drug Reaction Monitoring by visiting the website npa.gov.my [Consumers → Reporting Side Effects to Medicines (ConSERF) or Vaccines (AEFI)]

Storage and Disposal of Betasolve Cream

– Storage

- Store below 30°C.
- Protect from light.
- Keep out of reach of children.
- Keep cap tightly closed.

– Disposal

Do not use this after the expiry date. An expiry date is printed on the label and box of the medicine.

Medicines should not be disposed of via wastewater or household waste. Ask your pharmacist how to dispose of medicines no longer required. These measures will help to protect the environment.
