What Pinetarsol Gel is used for

- An adjunct treatment to help relieve itchy and inflamed skin
- To relieve the symptoms of dermatitis, inflamed scaly skin, jock itch, anal and genital itching and other minor skin irritations.

How Pinetarsol Gel works

- Soap free cleansing gel with pine tar to relieve severe itching and reduce inflammation
- A soap alternative as soap may irritate tender and inflamed skin.

Before you use Pinetarsol Gel

- When you must not use it

This product should not be used by individuals with known sensitivity to any ingredients of this product.

- Before you start to use it

Please discuss with your doctor or pharmacist before using the product.

- Taking other medicines

Currently there have been no reports of problems when this product is used with other medicines.

How to use Pinetarsol Gel

- How much to use

Apply to wet skin and smooth gently over affected area. Leave on 2-3 minutes. Rinse and pat skin dry.

- When to use it

Use as often as required, whenever inflamed areas are washed.

- How long to use it

Please follow the advice of the doctor or pharmacist.

- If you forget to use it

If forget to use this medicine, use it as soon as remember. Then next, use this medicine at the usual time.

- If you use too much (overdose)

No information is available concerning overdosage in human beings following topical application.

While you are using it

- Things you must do

Avoid contact with eyes. For external use only.

- Things you must not do

Do not swallow. Do not use on broken skin.

- Things to be careful of

If gel enters eyes, flush immediately with clean water. Avoid using soap as soap may irritate tender inflamed skin. If any irritation occurs, discontinue use.

Side effects

There are no known side effects for pine tar when used topically. Allergy to any ingredient may cause skin irritation. Allergic reactions are rare. You may report any side effects or adverse drug reactions directly to the National Centre for

Storage and Disposal of Pinetarsol Gel

- Storage

Store below 30°C. Keep out of reach of children.

- Disposal

Pinetarsol Gel should not be disposed of via wastewater or household waste. Ask your pharmacist how to dispose of Pinetarsol Gel that is no longer required. These measures will help to protect the environment.

- What it looks like

Pinetarsol Gel is jade green opaque gel with a smell characteristic of pine tar. Available in 100g tubes and 450g bottles with pump.

- Ingredients

- Active ingredients: pine tar.
- Inactive ingredients: purified water, patent blue V CI42051, laureth-23, laureth-4, dichlorobenzyl alcohol, cocamide DEA, glycerol, trolamine lauril sulfate, trolamine, lauryl betaine, phenethyl alcohol, C10-30 alkyl acrylate crosspolymer, methyl hydroxybenzoate.
