What Pinetarsol Bath Oil is used for

- To relieve severe itching and reduce inflammation
- To relieve the symptoms of eczema/dermatitis (inflammation of the outer layer of the skin), psoriasis (auto-immune inflammatory skin disorder) and other dry, itchy, inflamed or flaky skin conditions

How Pinetarsol Bath Oil works

- Anti-itch moisturising cleanser
- Non-greasy, water dispersible oil for dry skin, with pine tar to relieve severe itching and reduce inflammation
- A soap alternative as soap may irritate dry, tender and inflamed skin.

Before you use Pinetarsol Bath Oil

- When you must not use it This product should not be used by individuals with known sensitivity to any ingredients of this product.

- Before you start to use it

Please discuss with your doctor or pharmacist before using the product.

- Taking other medicines Currently there have been no reports of problems when this product is used with other medicines.

How to use Pinetarsol Bath Oil

- How much to use

Bath: Add 15-30 mL* to a warm to tepid bath (5 mL* to baby's or hand basin). *One capful contains 5 mL. Shower: Apply a small amount onto wet skin. <u>- When to use it</u> Bathe for 5-10 minutes once daily, more often in severe cases. <u>- How long to use it</u> Please follow the advice of the doctor or pharmacist. <u>- If you forget to use it</u> If forget to use this medicine, use

it as soon as remember. Then next, use this medicine at the usual time.

- *If you use too much (overdose)* No information is available concerning overdosage in human beings following topical application.

While you are using it

<u>Things you must do</u>
Avoid contact with eyes. For external use only.
<u>Things you must not do</u>
Do not swallow.
<u>Things to be careful of</u>
If any irritation occurs,
discontinue use.

There are no known side effects for pine tar when used topically. Allergy to any ingredient may cause skin irritation.
