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What Pinetarsol Bath Oil is used for

- To relieve severe itching and reduce inflammation
- To relieve the symptoms of eczema/dermatitis (inflammation of the outer layer of the skin), psoriasis (auto-immune inflammatory skin disorder) and other dry, itchy, inflamed or flaky skin conditions

How Pinetarsol Bath Oil works

- Anti-itch moisturising cleanser
- Non-greasy, water dispersible oil for dry skin, with pine tar to relieve severe itching and reduce inflammation
- A soap alternative as soap may irritate dry, tender and inflamed skin.

Before you use Pinetarsol Bath Oil

- When you must not use it

This product should not be used by individuals with known sensitivity to any ingredients of this product.

- Before you start to use it

Please discuss with your doctor or pharmacist before using the product.

- Taking other medicines

Currently there have been no reports of problems when this product is used with other medicines.

How to use Pinetarsol Bath Oil

- How much to use

One capful contains 5 mL. Shake bottle well before use. Bath: Add 15-30 mL to a warm to tepid bath (5 mL* to baby's bath or hand basin).

Shower: Apply a small amount onto wet skin, leave a few minutes, briefly rinse.

Pat skin dry.

- When to use it

Bathe for 5-10 minutes once daily, more often in severe cases.

- How long to use it

Please follow the advice of the doctor or pharmacist.

- If you forget to use it

If forget to use this medicine, use it as soon as remember. Then next, use this medicine at the usual time.

- If you use too much (overdose)

No information is available concerning overdosage in human beings following topical application.

While you are using it

- Things you must do

For external use only.

Avoid contact with eyes. Keep out of reach of children.

- Things you must not do

Do not swallow.

- Things to be careful of

May cause the bath to become slippery. Handle baby with care.

This product may make dressings and clothing catch fire more easily with a naked flame.

If any irritation occurs, discontinue use.

Side effects

There are no known side effects for pine tar when used topically. Allergy to any ingredient may cause skin irritation.

Store below 30°C.
