

DERMOPLEX BURN-AID CREAM

Acridlavine 0.1% (w/w)

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What Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream is used for

Treating burns, minor cuts, wounds, insect bites, sores, rashes and abrasions

How Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream works

Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream contains acridlavine, an antiseptic that helps to prevent infection and aids healing.

Before you use Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream

- When you must not use it

Do not use this medicine if you have an allergy to:

- Acridlavine
- any of the other ingredients listed at the end of this leaflet

Do not use this medicine after the expiry date printed on the pack or if the packaging is torn or shows signs of tampering. If it has expired or is damaged, return it to your pharmacist for disposal.

If you are not sure whether you should start using this medicine, talk to your doctor.

: Before you start to use it

Tell your doctor if you have allergies to any other medicines, foods, preservatives or dyes.

: Taking other medicines

Tell your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking any other medicines, including any that you get without a prescription from your pharmacy, supermarket or health food shop.

Some medicines and Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream may interfere with each other.

Speak to your pharmacist or doctor before taking this product with other medicines.

Your doctor or pharmacist has more information on medicines to be careful with or to avoid while using Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream.

How to use Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream

Follow all directions given to you by your doctor or pharmacist carefully. They may differ from the information contained in this leaflet. If you do not understand the instructions, ask your doctor or pharmacist for help.

: How much to use

Smear cream on a piece of lint or dressing and apply directly to the affected area. Secure with bandage or adhesive plaster.

If symptoms do not go away, talk to your doctor

: When to use it

Use Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream as your doctor has prescribed.

: How long to use it

Continue using your medicine for as long as your doctor tells you.

: If you forget to use it

If you forget to apply the medicine, you can apply it as soon as you remember.

: If you use too much (overdose)

: When used as recommended, overdosing with Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream is rare.

While you are using it

: Things you must do

Always follow your doctor's instructions carefully. Tell your doctor if you are pregnant or breast-feeding.

: Things you must not do

Do not use Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream to treat any other complaints unless your doctor tells you to.

Do not give your medicine to anyone else, even if they have the same condition as you.

: Things to be careful of

- For use on the skin only.
- Avoid contact with eyes.

Side effects

All medicines can have side effects. Sometimes they are serious, most of the time they are not. You may need medical attention if you get some of the side effects.

Do not be alarmed by the following lists of side effects. You may not experience any of them.

Ask your doctor or pharmacist to answer any questions you may have. If any side effect becomes severe, or

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you experience any side effect not listed here, please tell your pharmacist or doctor.

You may report any side effects or adverse drug reactions directly to the National Centre for Adverse Drug Reaction Monitoring by visiting the website npra.gov.my [Consumers -> Reporting Side Effects to Medicines (ConSERF) or Vaccines (AEFI)]

Storage and Disposal of Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream

- Storage

Keep container tightly closed.

Store the cream in its original packaging. Store in a dry place below 30°C. Protect from light.

Do not store Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream or any other medicine in the bathroom or near a sink. Do not leave it on a window sill or in the car. Heat and dampness can destroy some medicines.

Keep Dermoplex Burn-Aid Cream away from children.

- Disposal

If your doctor tells you to stop taking this medicine or the expiry date has passed, ask your pharmacist what to do with any medicine that is left.
