

Erbinox Terbinafine Hydrochloride Cream 1% w/w

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What **ERBINOX** is used for

Indicated for the treatment of skin infection such as Athlete's foot, Ringworm, Cracking and scaling associated with jock itch, Relieving itching, Burning and other fungal infections of the skin.

How **ERBINOX** works

ERBINOX Cream contains Terbinafine Hydrochloride. It is a type of antifungal. ERBINOX Cream destroys or prevents the growth of fungi, which cause skin infections.

Before you use **ERBINOX**

- When you must not use it

Do not take ERBINOX if you:

- If you are allergic to Terbinafine Hydrochloride.
- If you are allergic (hypersensitive) to any of the other ingredients in your medicine.

- Before you start to use it

Talk to your doctor or pharmacist before taking ERBINOX:

- Take special care if you are going to use this medicine near your eyes.

Pregnancy and lactation

If you are pregnant or breast-feeding, think you may be pregnant or are planning to have a baby, ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice before taking this medicine. You must not take ERBINOX if you are pregnant or think you might be.

- Taking other medicines

Please tell your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking, or have recently taken any other medicines. This includes any medicines which you have bought without prescription.

How to use **ERBINOX**

- How much to use

Always use ERBINOX Cream exactly as your doctor has told you. You should check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure.

- When to use it

Always use ERBINOX Cream exactly as your doctor has told you. You should check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure.

- How long to use it

Continue using ERBINOX for the duration that the doctor recommends.

- If you forget to use it

If you forget to use this medicine, use it as soon as you remember. Then next use this medicine at the usual time.

If you have any further questions about using this medicine, please ask your doctor or pharmacist.

- If you use too much (overdose)

Contact your doctor immediately or go to the Emergency Department of your nearest hospital, if you think you or anyone else may have used too much of this medicine. Do this even if there are no signs of discomfort or poisoning. You may need urgent medical attention.

Taking too many tablets may cause the symptoms described side effects section.

While you are using it

- Things you must do

Use your medicine exactly as your doctor has told you.

Tell all the doctors, dentists and pharmacists treating you that you are using ERBINOX.

- Things you must not do

Do not stop using the medicine unless advised by your doctor.

Do not use any new medicines without consulting your doctor or pharmacist.

Do not share ERBINOX to anyone else, even if they have the same symptoms or condition as you.

- Things to be careful of

Driving and using machines

ERBINOX cream has no influence on the ability to drive and use machines.

Side effects

Like all medicines, ERBINOX can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.

Stop taking ERBINOX immediately and contact your doctor or pharmacist if you experience any of the following side effects after using this medicine.

You must get urgent medical help if you have any of the following symptoms. You may be having an allergic reaction:

- You have difficulty breathing
- Your face or throat swell
- Your skin develops a severe rash.

Very common side effects:

- Irritation at site of application (including pain, burning, stinging and skin redness)
- Itching
- Rash

Rare side effects

- Eye irritation, Dry skin, redness and swelling of the skin

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Storage and Disposal of ERBINOX**- Storage**

Do not store above 30 °C. Do not freeze. Keep out of reach of children.

Product Description**- What it looks like**

ERBINOX Cream is a white to off white cream available in 15g tubes.

- Ingredients**- Active ingredient**

The active substance in ERBINOX Cream is Terbinafine Hydrochloride (1.00% w/w), in a cream base.

- Inactive ingredients

Chitosan (Chitopharm-M), White Soft Paraffin (White Petrolatum), Cetostearyl Alcohol, Polyoxyl 20 Cetostearyl Ether, Light Liquid Paraffin, Isopropyl Myristate, Propylene Glycol, Benzyl Alcohol, Disodium Edetate, Lactic Acid, Disodium Hydrogen Phosphate and Purified Water.

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
