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#### What it is used for

Solcoseryl® Jelly:

The jelly promotes wound healing. It is particularly used for treating venous stasis ulcers, decubital ulcers, acute and chronic skin inflammation (dermatitis), secondary and tertiary burns.

# Solcoseryl® Ointment:

It promotes the healing of dry wounds and particularly suitable for minor burns and abrasions. It is used in combination with the Jelly for deep, poorly healing wounds to protect the newly formed skin. This reduces the healing time and results in cosmetics improvement in the scarring.

## How it works

Solcoseryl® Jelly and Ointment promote the re-functionalization of hypoxia and/ or lack substrate of reversibly damaged tissue and speed up as well as improve the quality of the healing of lesions.

# Before you use it

### - When you must not use it

Do not use Solcoseryl® Jelly and Ointment if you are hypersensitive or allergic to parahydroxybenzoates (E210, E216, E218) which are present as preservatives.

# - Before you start to use it

Tell your doctor before you start to use Solcoseryl® Jelly/ Ointment if:

- You have other allergies.
- Suffering from other illnesses

#### -Taking other medicines

Tell your doctor if you are taking any other medicines, including medicines you buy without a prescription from a pharmacy, supermarket or health food shop.

## How to use it

# - How much to use

Solcoseryl<sup>®</sup> Jelly is applied thinly 2- 3 times a day.

Solcoseryl® Ointment is applied 1-2 times a day and covered with a dressing.

# - When to use it

Use as prescribed by the physicians.

# - How long to use it

Solcoseryl<sup>®</sup> Jelly is appled until fresh skin tissue has formed. Solcoseryl<sup>®</sup> Ointment is applied until the wound is completely healed.

# - If you forget to use it

To be advised.

Please contact your physicians.

## - If you use too much (overdose)

Toxic effects from overdosage of Solcoseryl® Jelly or Ointment have not been reported.

## While you are using it

#### - Things you must do

Before application of Solcoseryl® Jelly, recent, weeping abrasions should be dried with a piece of gauze. It is advisable to cover the newly formed skin at the edge of poorly healing ulcers or wounds using Solcoseryl® Ointment. Solcoseryl® Ointment is applied and covered with a dressing. Do not massage in.

## - Things you must not do

No special precautions are necessary on the use in accordance with the instruction.

Do not use the product after the date indicated by 'Exp' on the container.

#### - Things to be careful of

If the effect of the medicine is too strong or weak, speak to your physician or pharmacist

#### **Side effects**

After application of Solcoseryl® Jelly, an unpleasant stinging may occur for a short time. This does not mean the product should be discontinued.

In very rare cases, hypersensitivity reactions may occur. If unusual skin reactions occur, discontinue the product and inform your physician or pharmacist.
