

KOYOKU PLASTER BERUBAT

Menthol (6.3 % w/w), Methyl Salicylate (3.2% w/w), Camphor (2.0% w/w)

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What Koyoku Plaster Berubat is used for

For temporary relief of muscle and joint pains, backaches, stiff shoulder, bruise and sprain.

How Koyoku Plaster Berubat work

Methyl salicylate penetrates into the skin where it is converted to salicylic acid.

Menthol when applied dilates the blood vessels, causing a sensation of coldness followed by an analgesic effect.

Camphor acts as a rubefacient and mild analgesic.

Before you use Koyoku Plaster Berubat

-When you must not use it

Do not take this medicine if you are intolerant to any ingredients of this medicine.

Pregnancy and Lactation

Ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice before taking this medicine.

-Before you start to use it

Avoid direct application into the nostrils.

For external use only.

Contraindicated to infants below 2 years of age.

-Taking other medicines

Inform your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking other medicines.

How to use Koyoku Plaster Berubat

-How much to use

Clean and dry the affected area, and then apply plaster to the affected area. If necessary, replace the plaster once or twice daily.

-When to use it

Use when you are suffering from muscle and joint pains, backaches, stiff shoulder, bruise and sprain.

-How long to use it

Please follow the advice of the doctor or pharmacist.

-If you forgot to use it

Use the plaster soonest as you remember to reduce your discomfort.

-If you use too much (overdose)

When used externally, overdosing is unlikely. If you think you or anyone may have used too much of this medicated plaster, please refer to doctor or pharmacist advice.

While you are using Koyoku Plaster Berubat

-Things you must do

Keep the affected area from getting wet.

-Things you must not do

Do not apply on wounds or damaged skin.

-Things must be careful of

Caution must be exercised when older children are treated.

Keep out reach of children.

Side Effects

Visit your doctor or pharmacist immediately if you experience any side effects after using this medicine.

Storage and Disposal of Koyoku Plaster Berubat

-Storage

Keep in a dry place below 30°C.

Keep out reach of children.

-Disposal

Medicines should not be disposed of via wastewater or household waste.

Ask your pharmacist how to dispose of medicines no longer required.

These measures will help to protect the environment.

-What it looks like

White fabric rectangular plaster (42mm x 60mm or 150mm x 100mm) coated with thin layer of medicate colloid covered with an isolating film, comes with menthol smell.

-Ingredients

Active Ingredients: Menthol, Methyl Salicylate, Camphor

Inactive Ingredients: Thermoplastic polymer, gum rosin, white mineral oil, oleoresin capsicum, zinc oxide, propylene glycol and glycerin.
